ASTHMA AWARENESS MONTH IN FLORIDA

WHEREAS, in 2019, the high prevalence of asthma in the U.S. affected approximately 25 million Americans, among them nearly 1.3 million Florida adults; and

WHEREAS, asthma is a chronic condition that involves inflammation of the airways, causing breathing difficulty, wheezing, chest tightness, and coughing; and

WHEREAS, approximately 7.4% of Florida adults and 7.6% of Florida children currently have asthma; and

WHEREAS, asthma is more common among children, women, low-income and inner-city residents, and minority communities; and

WHEREAS, exposure to allergens and irritants such as dust mites, mold, cockroaches, pet dander, and secondhand smoke can trigger an asthma episode; and

WHEREAS, secondhand smoke worsens children's asthma, a situation affecting up to one million children in the U.S.; and

WHEREAS, there are simple steps people can take to reduce their exposure to environmental asthma triggers; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Asthma Program, within the Florida Department of Health, coordinates statewide efforts to reduce asthma disparities and hospitalization rates, as well as increase the number of people with asthma receiving self-management education; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Health encourages Floridians to identify and reduce their exposure to environmental triggers; and

WHEREAS, the month of May is designated as National and International Asthma Awareness Month; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ron DeSantis, Governor of the State of Florida, do hereby extend my support to all observing the month of May 2022 as Asthma Awareness Month in Florida.
